e. Pending Grant Applications

- i. East Stan, East Merced and Madera have been awarded WETA grant for a mobile irrigation lab. No contract yet, but expect funding to begin July 1st, which is already Irrigation evaluation season. EMRCD will earn \$52,441 per year for three years for a total of \$157,323. The board needs to approve acceptance of grant once contract is in hand, and to hit the ground running July 1st.
- ii. Board approved spending \$250+50 to send Raini to Irrigation Training and Research class. This class has a second location, with added expense.
- iii. Discussion of position offer w/o training class and field training, or Raini could attend the first part only.
- iv. CARCD monarch habitat grant, asking about \$338,000 for 4 EMRCD projects, submitted.
- v. FEMA nature-based planning grant solely for planning, submitted.
