- d. Bookkeeping and Audit Updates
 - Ursula discovered error in county finance figures and needs to make correction with county, will take a visit or two
 - Ursula working to complete QuickBooks entries for 2021-22, so she can use it to produce monthly reports and have a clear picture of the RCD's finances. Audit interfered.
 - iii. Letter from Auditor in Board packet

Audit for 19-20 FY determination: options to resolve \$12,906 retention receivable on books for three years: 2017,18,19.

- Accept "qualified" opinion form auditor (unmodified is best = clear opinion,)
 except the retention funds
- 2. Do more homework- check with past auditors' daughter for his notes
- Do more homework- sign letter to MID to get numbers, but we are unsure if they are involved.

Discussion.

Qualified Motion with conditional approval;, Jean will follow up in next 2 weeks and if unsuccessful, accept qualified audit. (Reyn/Shirish), unanimous approval.

- e. Pending Grant Applications:
 - i. East Stan, East Merced and Madera have been awarded WETA grant for a mobile irrigation lab. No contract yet, but expect funding to begin July 1st, which is already Irrigation evaluation season. EMRCD will earn \$52,441 per year for three years for a total of \$157,323. The board needs to approve acceptance of grant once contract is in hand, and staffing needs to begin now to find a decent match to hit the ground running July 1st
 - Budget and Staffing Discussion.
 - 2. Hire Raini for Aug and Sept to be irrigation specialist.

Motion to approve offering Raini a position as irrigation specialist in Aug/Sept: (Reyn/Bob), unanimous approval.

Approve spending \$250+50 to send her to Irrigation Training and research class.

Motion to pay for \$300 ITRC class: (Reyn/Bob), unanimous approval.

 Approve expenditure to run a position opening for an intern and to begin the process of hiring for July 1.

Motion to initiate hiring process for summer intern for WETA grant with the possibility for permanent hire: (Shirish/Jean), unanimous approval.

- ii. CARCD monarch habitat grant, asking about \$338,000 for 4 EMRCD projects, submitted
- iii. FEMA, nature based planning grant solely for planning, submitted
- f. Pending contracts with partners (ACTION)
 - iv. MID needs a "resolution" to continue with processing water trailer grant funding

Motion to accept Resolution of the Board 2022 04 #2: Conservation district's Board approved applying for, accepting, implementing grant to buy trailer for use at restoration sites: (Bob/Reyn) Passes unanimously.

 Renew contract through E Stan, billing through their payroll to enable her being a GrizzlyCorps member and employee of EMerced, and to continue after GC Fellowship for 2 months.

Motion to extend payroll contract with EStanislaus and add new one for tech assistance: (Sharish/Bob), unanimous approval

Trina mentioned that the CSDA represents all SD, including parks, cemeteries, mosquito abatement, etc. Their information is less specific to RCDs, whereas CARCD is RCD specific and offers more value for her time.
- ii. Spoke with Mandy Parkes and she has another opinion: NACD at \$775/yr offers 2 EASY Technical Assistance grants and they pay the check out up front, we send in progress reports. The Urban as is one of the few changeable grants and involves a phone call to Ariel River.

- iii. Ask Jean for contact person to join NACD for \$1. Jean mentioned that the next Meeting in Chowchilla on June 2nd, might offer more info.
- Jean is shrign a booth at the County Fair representing EMRCD with Grasslands. Come visit, June 8-12.
